Idioms

1. up the ante

If you *up the ante*, you increase your demands or the risks in a situation in order to achieve a better result.

2. cross the Rubicorn

To do something that you cannot later change and will strongly influence future events.

Most EU states have crossed the rubicon and adopted the Euro.

3. on tenterhooks

Worried or nervous about something that is going to happen. We were on tenterhooks all morning waiting for the phone to ring.

Basic doubt clearance

1. vice (noun) Vs vice (adjective)

Noun usage: immoral or evil conduct or habit. Eg. *Gossiping is a vice, not a virtue.*

Adjective usage: designating a person below another in rank.

Eg. vice president, vice admiral, vice captain

2. doctor (noun) Vs doctor (verb)

Noun usage : a person with a medical degree whose job is to treat people who are ill or hurt/a person who has the highest degree (= qualification) from a college or university.

Eg. You better consult a doctor for your illness.

Verb usage: to change something in order to deceive people. Eg. *They doctored the company's sales details.*

(i) Power packed 'adverbs'

Feel the power of adverbs in your communication. Dear language lovers, just imagine the following sentences without the last word, emotionless, right?

He answered <u>confidently</u>.

She completed the programme successfully.

He reviewed the project <u>thoroughly</u>.

She drew the picture <u>creatively</u>.

They participated the games energetically.

She sang the song mellifluously.

Here comes the relevance of adverbs! All these underlined words are adverbs which have the power to give an extra emotion to the communication. Use them lavishly in your communication!

(ii) Confusable pairs

Learnt Vs learned

a. learnt and learned: These are the past form and past participle form of the root verb 'learn.' Learnt is more British whereas 'learned' is more American.

It has only a single syllable - /lɜːnt/

Eg. I have learnt/learned a lot from you.

b. learned - /ˈlɜː.nɪd/

Here, the adjective form is considered, where it has two syllables: LER-ned.

A learned person has studied for a long time and has a lot of knowledge:

Eg. He is a learned professor.

Bjornstjerne Bjornson

The Nobel Prize in Literature 1903 was awarded to Bjornstjerne Bjornson "as a tribute to his noble, magnificent and versatile poetry, which has always been distinguished by both the freshness of its inspiration and the rare purity of its spirit".

The first Norwegian Nobel laureate, he was a prolific polemicist and extremely influential in Norwegian public life and Scandinavian cultural debate.He is also celebrated for his lyrics to the Norwegian national anthem, "Ja, vi elskerdettelandet".

Mario Puzo Book : The Godfather

Mario Puzo, best known as the author of The Godfather, was born on October 15, 1920 in the Hell's Kitchen area of New York

City. He served in the U. S. Army during World War II, and when he returned attended New York's School for Social Research and Columbia University. He wrote pulp stories and edited Male magazine before publishing his first novel, The Dark Arena (1955). His works were wellreceived critically, but failed to generate much revenue until he published his most notable work, The Godfather, which was ultimately made into a trilogy of award-winning movies. Puzo continued writing novels, and his final work, 'Omerta', was finished not long before his death. He won the Academy Award for Best Adapted Screenplay in both 1972, and 1974. Puzo died on July 2, 1999 in Bay Shore, Long Island.



Know the book THE CALL OF THE WILD


The Call of the Wild is a short adventure novel by Jack London, published in 1903 and set in Yukon, Canada, during the 1890s Klondike Gold Rush, when strong sled dogs were in high demand. The central character of the novel is a dog named Buck. The story opens at a ranch in Santa Clara Valley, California, when Buck is stolen from his home and sold into service as a sled dog in Alaska. He becomes progressively more primitive and wild in the harsh environment, where he is forced to fight to survive and dominate other dogs. By the end, he sheds the veneer of civilization, and relies on primordial instinct and learned experience to emerge as a leader in the wild.

Actually, spoonerism is a mistake made when speaking in which the first sounds of two words are exchanged with each other to produce a not intended and usually funny meaning.


